| SYNOPSIS THE DEC'D IS A 35-YR OLD CAUCASIAN FEMALE WITH A REPORTED HX OF METH, COCAINE, AND HEROIN ABUSE. SHE HAD BEEN TAKING ZYPREXA, TRAZODONE, CLONAZEPAM, AND MIRTAZAPINE. SHE RECENTLY SEEMED LETHARGIC AND WAS HEARING VOICES (NO REPORTED MENTAL HEALTH/MEDICAL PROBLEMS PER FAMILY). ON 06/27/05, SHE WAS BATHING AT HER RESIDENCE AND TALKING TO A FRIEND WHEN SHE SUDDENLY BECAME UNRESPONSIVE. THE FRIEND PHONED 911 AND MEDICS FOUND THE DEC'D IN FULL ARREST. SHE WAS TRANSPORTED IN ASYSTOLE TO THE ER WHERE THEIR CONTINUED LIFE-SAVING EFFORTS COULD NOT RESUSCITATE HER AND SHE WAS PRONOUNCED AT 2311 HRS. Investigation:

At 1230 hrs on 06/28/05, Lt. MacVillie assigned me the apparent ACCIDENT death of Domino Harvey for investigation. Ms. Harvey was pronounced at 2311 hrs on 06/27/05 at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center and her death was reported to Robin Webber at the Forensic Science Center at 2322 hrs on 06/27/05 by RN Daniels. Ms Harvey was subsequently transported to the FSC

Informant/Witness Statements:

According to Alexandra De Krassel, approximately (5) days ago, the decedent and her aunt, [REDACTED], hired her, Michelle Barash, and Peter Dice as "sober guardians". She advised that they were essentially hired to be her constant companions and to keep her from using narcotics, alcohol, and associating with people who were bad influences since the decedent's recent release from federal prison on \$1.3 million bail for narcotic violations. The decedent was under house arrest at the time of her death with a monitoring device attached to her ankle and was scheduled to start court proceedings in October 2005.

Ms. De Krassel advised that they each worked 12-hr shifts and that on 06/26/05, she noticed that the decedent seemed lethargic, was hearing voices, and was having short-term memory loss. She and the decedent's aunt felt that the decedent was being overmedicated (Cionazepam, Trazedone, Zyprexa, and Mirtazapine) and decided to keep the decedent's medications and administer them to her.

Ms. De Krassel advised that Peter Dice was with the decedent in the evening hours on 06/27/05. At approximately 2200 hrs that evening, the decedent was in the bathroom taking a bath. Mr. Dice was seated outside of the bathroom door carrying on a conversation with the decedent while she bathed. A few minutes later, she suddenly stopped talking. He called out to her, however, she did not answer. He then opened the door and found her unresponsive in the bathtub. He began CPR and phoned 911.

According to [REDACTED], the decedent had a history of methamphetamine abuse. After the decedent's release on bail from federal prison, the decedent's forensic psychiatrist, Dr Glaser (818 382-9920) prescribed anti-depressants and anti-psychotics due to the decedent's depression as well as in an effort to assist her during her detoxification from narcotics. Her niece had no history of suicidal statements or attempts. To her knowledge, her niece had no medical problems and no prior mental health problems.

According to the medical record, at 2229 hrs on 06/27/05, LACO Fire Squad #7 responded to 638 N. Huntley in response to an unresponsive female inside. When they arrived, they found the decedent supine on the floor in cardiac arrest. They were advised that she had been in the bathtub and had a history of heroin, methamphetamine, and cocaine abuse. They administered medication and intubated her and transported her in asystole to the ER. ER staff continued the



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paramedics' life-saving efforts, however, she did not respond to their efforts and was pronounced at 2311 hrs by Dr. Katz.

Scene Description:

None visited as the decedent was pronounced at the hospital.

Evidence:

On 06/28/05, Ms. De Krassel brought the decedent's medications to the FSC. I subsequently booked them as "Medical Evidence" at the FSC.

Body Examination:

The decedent is viewed at the FSC as a Caucasian female in her mid 30's with short brown hair, green eyes, and natural teeth. There is a faint horizontal scar to her inner left wrist and (3) surgical scars to each breast. There is a black monitoring device around her right ankle.

There is an ET in place and an IV to her inner left arm. There is red streaking around the IV site and to her left wrist. There is also a blue-green tinge to her left wrist. Brown purge is seen coming from her mouth and nose. Blood-tinged foam is seen coming from the ET. No obvious petechiae is seen to her eyes. No obvious trauma to her head or body is seen.

Identification:

The decedent was identified as: Domino Harvey, DOB 08/07/69, Main #32251711 by DOJ fingerprints at 1531 hrs on 06/28/2005

Next of Kin Notification:

According to the decedent was unmarried and had no children at the time of her death. Her mother, [redacted], was notified of her daughter's death on 06/28/05 by family members.

Tissue Donation:

The decedent is no longer a candidate.

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OPINION:

Autopsy with toxicological examination is significant for the presence of fentanyl is several postmortem specimens. The heart blood and liver show levels typically seen in fatal overdoses. Though other specimens show lower "normal" or "therapeutic" levels that could be seen in tolerant individuals with, for example, chronic severe pain or cancer, this decedent did not fit that profile. No other toxicological or natural disease process is present to explain death. Though the decedent was found unresponsive in a bathtub, drowning did not play any role in this death. Due to the drug overdose, the manner of death is accident, based on the circumstances.
